Dear Parents,

I hope you and your families are all well and that you too enjoyed the half-term break.

Academic news

We received during half term our ISDR (Inspection Data Summary Report) which analysed our results last year. We are pleased to report that:

Reading

Key stage 2 progress in reading (3.9) was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022. Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in reading (94%) and the high standard (110+) in reading (48%) was significantly above national and in the highest 20% in 2022.

Maths

Key stage 2 progress in mathematics (4.5) was significantly **above** national and in the **highest** 20% in 2022. Key stage 2 attainment of the high standard (110+) in mathematics (55%) was significantly **above** national and in the **highest** 20% in 2022.

Grammar, punctuation and spelling test

Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in the English grammar, punctuation and spelling test (94%) and the high standard (110+) in the English grammar, punctuation and spelling test (48%) was significantly **above** national and in the **highest** 20% in 2022.

Attainment at key stage 2 – 2022

Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in reading, writing and mathematics (81%) was significantly **above** national and in the **highest** 20% in 2022.

Congratulations to all involved in these amazing results. While we celebrate the end of the school results, we all know that this journey is an accumulation of 7 years at SJF as well as the committed partnership with parents and families. For most pupils this begins early in development goals, nursery, reception and high-quality teaching and with milestones such as phonics and KS1 tests along the way.

Attendance

Collection times

Please note, no student will be allowed to remain on the school premises at any time after 3.05pm unsupervised i.e. without a legitimate reason to be in school as part of an organised after school activity. If there is an emergency and you are running late, for whatever reason, please call/email the office to let us know. If a child is not collected by 3.10 p.m., they will be brought into the after school club and the after school care fee will be applied.

Admissions applications for Autumn Term 2023

Children are admitted to the school in September of the year in which they have their fifth birthday. If there is anyone who wishes to apply for a place for September 2023 (d.o.b. 01.09.2018 – 31.08.2019) please obtain a Supplementary information form from the school office. There will be an Open morning on October 28^{th} 9 – 11 a.m. and on November 16^{th} 1.30 – 3.30 p.m. for all prospective parents. Please inform any interested family and friends.

Secondary school applications

Primary, Junior and Secondary headteachers are reminded to advise parents to apply for three schools and that for secondary admissions the national closing date is 31st October, and national offer date 1st March (or next working day). Catholic secondary schools will have supplementary forms too which must also be completed. The majority of Year 6 children at St John Fisher would go to St. Paul's, or English Martyrs. Local secondary schools such as the ones in Wigston and Oadby have their own admission policies and it would be well worth consulting those.
