OVERVIEW FOR HINDUISM

Judaism is studied by everyone and Hinduism one of the options of choice from the three other religions. It is taught for one week every year. The themes are the same for all religions.

Hinduism is one of the oldest religions of the world. It has no known founder, but is deeply rooted in Indian culture, having begun in the Indus Valley abut 5,000 years ago. There are many shared beliefs among Hindus but it is a flexible religion which allows people to express their belief and worship in different ways. The programme of study here is a middle way, offering what is most general in Hinduism, but not necessarily what every Hindu would believe or live. Spellings of words may vary.
