Uniform: Change of supplier

This message is to inform you about a change to our school uniform supplier. Marks & Spencer (M&S) will no longer be offering embroidered uniform items for St John Fisher CVA or indeed any other schools. We understand this may cause some inconvenience, and we apologise for any disruption this may cause.

What this means for you:

From 14th October 2024, you can no longer purchase pre-embroidered uniform items directly from M&S. Until then you still can buy these items.

We are actively searching for new suppliers to provide embroidered uniform options for the future. We will keep you updated on our progress and announce the new supplier as soon as possible.

Class Dojo – Communication

We are currently developing a comprehensive ClassDojo policy to ensure clear and consistent communication between staff and parents. This policy will be shared with the school community in the coming weeks.

In the meantime, we kindly ask parents to be mindful of a few key points when using ClassDojo to communicate with staff:

Response Times: Teachers prioritise their time during the school day to focus on delivering engaging lessons and supporting students. While they will endeavor to respond to ClassDojo messages as soon as possible, there may be times when a response is delayed.

Best Method of Communication: Urgent matters or those requiring a detailed response may be better by scheduling a meeting or phone call with the teacher.

We appreciate your understanding and continued cooperation. If you have any questions in the interim, please don't hesitate to contact the school office.

Lockdown policy and procedures

At St. John Fisher CVA, the safety and well-being of our students and staff is our top priority. As part of our ongoing commitment to a secure learning environment, we are currently in the process of formulating a comprehensive lockdown policy.
