

The Early Years Curriculum

- is divided into seven areas of learning.
- is a play and skills based approach to learning which is driven by children's interests and fascinations.



The seven areas of learning:

Communication and Language Development

Children are given opportunities to experience a rich language environment, to develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves. They speak and listen in a range of situations.

Physical Development

Children are provided with opportunities to be active and interactive, to develop their coordination, control and movement. Children begin to understand the importance of physical activity, and to make healthy food choices.

Mathematics

Involves providing children with opportunities to develop and strengthen their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers. They calculate simple addition and subtraction problems and describe shapes space and measure. Personal, Social and Emotional Development Children develop a positive sense of self, forming positive relationships with others. develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings. They understand appropriate behaviour in groups, and have confidence in their own abilities.

Expressive Arts and

Design Children explore and play with a wide range of media and materials, as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings. They experience art, music, dance, movement and role play.

Literacy Development

Children begin to link sounds and letters and begin to read and write. Children are given access to a range of reading materials (books, poems, and other reading materials) to ignite their interests.

Understanding the World

Children develop skills and knowledge in these areas through a mixture of child initiated and adult directed activities.

Early Reading

We believe that early reading is very important. We want our children to become life-long readers and promote the love of books through daily story time sessions. We encourage our children to use our lovely indoor and outdoor reading areas every day.

We also offer a personalised, online library through the *Reading Eggs* website. The children are taught how to become 'reading detectives'.



Phonics

- We follow the Ruth Miskin Read, Write, Inc phonics programme
- The children are taught phonics daily. The session is a mixture of learning sounds, reading and writing.

Assessment

- Once your child is settled and happy at school, we will make baseline assessments of what they are able to do. These will be practical activities done together with myself and Mrs Lam.
- Assessments are on-going through day-to-day activities by observing what the children have learned and identifying their next steps.
- We share some of the work we do at school through an online platform called ClassDojo. Parents can also share "wow moments" from home by using the portfolio.
- We assess all of the 7 areas using the Foundation Stage Profile.

A sunhat is required during hot and sunny weather. Blue and white checked summer dresses are allowed to be worn during the summer months. Your child will need a waterproof coat and wellies that can be left in school all year around.

Your child will also need a water bottle...





...and a pair of plimsolls to wear whilst they are inside school.

Everything your child brings to school must be marked clearly with their name.

Snack and milk time





- Every day, the children will be offered a healthy snack. This is either a piece of fruit or a vegetable. Alternatively, they are allowed to bring in their own fruit snack or vegetable snack from home or two plain biscuits.
- Through the *Cool Milk* scheme all children up until the age of 5 receive free milk and there is an option to pay for this scheme when your child turns five.

Snacks and Lunches



- All Reception children are offered a free school meal. Alternatively, they can bring in a packed lunch from home.
- We ask that you select their meal choices for them using the on-line system "Arbor"
