


Welcome

We, teachers and parents, have the chance to work as partners to ensure that at the end of this school year, your child will have a positive attitude towards their education based on social and academic confidence.



Attending Masses and participating fully - sing!







Illness

Parents are asked not to send their child to school if he/she is unwell. When children have been off school with sickness or diarrhoea parents are requested to keep them at home for 48 hours following the last attack.

Medicine in school: If your child requires regular, long-term medication such as an inhaler for asthma, then this should be discussed with the teacher and the school office. Any inhalers brought into school for use should be clearly labelled with the child's name and dosage requirements. There may be other occasions when your child needs to take medication for a short period of time but is well enough to come to school. In these instances you should contact the school to discuss your child's needs. All relevant forms are available from the school office.




Here are a few independence skills that you can practise with your child over


the summer to help prepare them for this area of learning. Ask your child to draw a smiley face in the box when they feel confident to complete each task independently.
