SATS

We are delighted with the KS2 SATS results which came out on Tuesday. We are so proud of our year 6s and how well they have done. We believe this is testament to the great teaching and learning the children have received from day 1, our close and supportive parent relationships, our excellent remote provision offer (at the end of Year 2 and Year 3) and our tailored curriculum when the children returned from lockdown. Congratulations everyone for the amazing results!

In 2022 the results for **St John Fisher CVA** are that 72% of pupils reached the expected national standard in reading, writing and maths. The percentage reaching the expected standard in individual subjects was 91% in reading, 88% in mathematics, 79% in the teacher assessment for writing. The average test scaled scores were 110 in reading, 106 in grammar, punctuation and spelling and 109 in mathematics.

National data for 2024 showed that 61% of pupils reached the expected national standard in reading, writing and maths. The percentage reaching the expected standard in individual subjects was 74% in reading, 73% in mathematics and 72% in the teacher assessment for writing.

Pupil outcomes

Year 1 Phonics

Our phonics pass rate in Year 1 this was a very high 93%. Well done to all! Your journey from learning to read to reading to learn is very positive and on track.

Year 4 MTC

The mean average score for the Year 4 cohort this year was 22.52 out of 25. A very high standard and one of the highest we have ever had at the school. Well done all!

We understand that sometimes students may not reach their targets. To address this, we'll be implementing targeted support strategies for these students. This ensures they continue to make progress and reach their full potential. We're here to help every child succeed!

School Sports Mark Gold Award

We are proud to announce that we have achieved the Gold School Games Mark 2023-24(6th year in a row) having demonstrated ongoing commitment, drive and dedication towards PE, school sport and physical activity.

Thank you to Mr Wheatley, Mr McVea and Mrs Astill for their amazing work earning this well deserved honour. Well done to all the children who have competed the school in many games, events and competitions with skill, fairness and enthusiasm.
