
7th February 2025

It is always pleasing to read the mainly very positive feedback we receive about the school and your child's experience and education. We are always endeavouring to improve and progress and some suggestions are very helpful to that aim. We have collated some issues into areas and what we will do as a result.

Academic – more information for parents on how to help

Please find included links to our <u>curriculum subject pages</u>. We will be sending out parent planners which outlines what your child will be learning in the coming term for summer.

In the October parents' evening, we will have books out for parents to look and browse.

Last year, we started and we will continue to send home test papers for children in Year 2-6 at the end of every term.

Homework is based on what your child has learned in the prior week. Online homework usually gives percentage scores and/or areas to work on.

We have parents' meetings for new entrants, Year 1 phonics, Year 4 Multiplication Times check and Year 6 SATS.

There are regular Reception parent afternoons about what your child is learning and how it is taught at school.

We will review other year groups and curriculum areas and lay out a schedule of presentations if required.

Parish Newsletter

We are a Catholic school in the parish of St Mary's & St John Bosco. Fr John is our parish priest. We are in dialogue with the parish about Masses and our links. We send out parish newsletters every Friday and we will try to add as an attachment to our normal newsletter.

Communication

What you said:

There were some issues with the volume of communications across dojo and arbor, and the functionality of Class Dojo.

Response and what we are doing:

We will look at streamlining communications so messaging is controlled and regular. The newsletter will become a central hub of news and updates and should be read. We will try to avoid duplication where possible.

We would also ask parents to be alert to dates in the diaries and timings, and also to respond to deadlines. We often have to send out reminders about consent for sporting events or trips up to and including the day of the event itself.

Class Dojo unfortunately does not have a pinned or search function. We have emailed them this suggestion.

Homework

This is a perennial issue. We had a parent survey last year and as a result, we changed our homework policy.

We will continue to refine e.g. after feedback, we will change Times Table Rockstars to fortnightly rather than weekly to match online homework. We have also disabled the chart function on TTRS so children can celebrate their own progress rather than compare.

CAREERS WEEK

Update: Disappointedly, we have had no volunteers for this week so far. I know how much the children take from this experience and it would be great to have volunteers within the wider school community to talk about their career. 
Payments for Meals & Wraparound Care

Please can you kindly check your account balance and top-up any low balance. If your child is regularly having school meals and/or is in breakfast club or afterschool club, it may be beneficial to either top-up to cover up to the end of half-term. Wraparound care can be booked in advance as far as the end of the term. We are unable to take bookings for wraparound care if there is insufficient funds on the account.

Booking for Breakfast Club & After school club

Please can you kindly book your child to the clubs via Arbor. For Breakfast club, you should be able to add your child to the club for the same morning up until 7.a.m. With regards to the after-school club, there is a cut of time of 12 hours. This is to enable the school to make sure that sufficient staff are available to cover the pupil numbers.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen on the Crucifix

No one can look at a crucifix and say that sin is not serious, nor can they ever say that it cannot be forgiven. By the way He suffered, He revealed the reality of sin; by the way He bore it, He shows His mercy toward the sinner.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen on the Holy Mass

What happened on calvary on that Good Friday 2000 years ago is happening now in every Mass, with one difference, on the cross the saviour was alone, in the Mass He is with us. The Holy Mass is the greatest event in the history of mankind for it is the only Holy Act which keeps the wrath of God from a sinful world, because it holds the cross between heaven and earth, renewing that decisive moment when our sad and tragic humanity journeyed suddenly forth to the fullness of supernatural life.

Pope St. John XXIII on Penance

Doing penance for one's sins is a first step towards obtaining forgiveness and winning eternal salvation. That is the clear and explicit teaching of Christ, and no one can fail to see how justified and how right the Catholic Church has always been in constantly insisting on this. She is the spokesman for her divine Redeemer. No individual Christian can grow in perfection, nor can Christianity gain in vigour, except it be on the basis of penance.

We have been told we can expect between £1,300 and £1,600 per month for the property if it comes up to standard so it will hopefully recoup the costs within a year or so of renting it. It cannot be let in its present state.
