

Questions 162-165 of the Penny Catechism

162. Who made the first part of the Hail Mary?

The Angel Gabriel and St. Elizabeth, inspired by the Holy Spirit, made the first part of the Hail Mary.

163. Who made the second part of the Hail Mary?

The Church of God, guided by the Holy Spirit, made the second part of the Hail Mary.

164. Why should we frequently say the Hail Mary?

We should frequently say the Hail Mary to put us in mind of the Incarnation of the Son of God: and to honour our Blessed Lady, the Mother of God.

165. Have we another reason for often saying the Hail Mary?

We have another reason for often saying the Hail Mary - to ask our Blessed Lady to pray for us sinners at all times, but especially at the hour of our death.

Note from Liturgy Meeting: One of the most common phrases from Vatican II regarding the Liturgy is that there must be a "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" of everyone. This means that the Liturgy is not just something people attend, it's something they do. It's an action of the whole Church, with each person exercising his or her unique role. And, above all, the role common to every person is an authentic interior participation (not just exterior) in the worship.

After Vatican II, the phrase "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" was commonly misunderstood to mean that everyone had to have an official role in the Liturgy. So if you didn't have an official role, were you participating less? Certainly not. Participation is first and foremost interior. Active and fruitful participation is achieved when your heart is engaged, and you participate with faith. If you haven't got used to, or don't favour, some of the sung parts or choice of eucharistic prayer, continue your inward prayer, your interior participation, don't let your preferences or unfamiliarity distract you from your participation, from liturgical unity.

Robbery at St. Mary's

Between the two Sunday Masses at St. Mary's the first collection was stolen from the safe.
