

<u>Catechism of the Catholic Church Paragraph 1 Teaching:</u> God created you out of sheer goodness so that you might know Him, love Him, and share forever in His own divine life. He didn't need to create us—He wanted to. You exist because He loves you. "God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life."

God is perfect and complete in Himself: He lacks nothing. He didn't make the world to get something, but to give something—His love. Our purpose is relationship: We are created not for usefulness but for communion with God. This communion starts now through faith, prayer, and love—and is fulfilled in heaven. Everything in the Catechism flows from this truth: God made us for Himself, and every aspect of Catholic life (prayer, sacraments, morality) flows from our created purpose.

Questions

- 1. "If God is perfect, why create anything at all?" Because love, by nature, gives itself. God is a Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—an eternal communion of love. Creation is the overflow of this love, not an act of need. Just as parents give life not because they have to, but because love wants to share itself, God created us to share in His joy.
- 2. "Isn't religion just a human attempt to explain life?" If that were true, all religions would be humans reaching up to God. But Christianity begins with God reaching down to us. CCC 1 shows that God freely reveals Himself and invites us into relationship. Faith is a response to this divine initiative, not mere human invention.
- 3. "What if I don't feel valuable or wanted?" Feelings can lie, but truth remains: you were made deliberately, in love, by God. Psalm 139 says God knit you together in your mother's womb. Jesus says even the hairs on your head are counted (Luke 12:7). You are not a mistake. You are willed.

Live it!

This teaching isn't abstract—it changes everything. If God made me for Himself, then: My life has eternal meaning, no matter how ordinary my days feel. I can turn to God in every situation, because I was created for friendship with Him. I must see others with dignity, because they were made for God too.

120th Anniversary of St. Mary's: This year marks the 120th anniversary of St Mary's. For over a century, the faith has been handed down here — through Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, marriages, and countless quiet acts of love and service. As your priest, I don't just want to look back — I want us to look forward together. This is a year to thank God for the past, and to recommit ourselves to living our faith more deeply now, in all three of our churches: St Mary's, St John Bosco, and St Edward's. Over the next few months, we'll be offering simple ways to mark this milestone: prayer cards, monthly reflections, and events to come. I warmly invite you to be part of it. The Church is not the building — it's all of us. And we are the ones who will shape the next 120 years. If anyone has any memories of St. Mary's, including any photos, please put them on the board if you have permission. To help us mark this anniversary 120 prayer cards are wanted for prisoners and the homebound, 120 tins of food for the food bank and 120 pairs of socks. 2 holy hours on different occasions will be offered to mark 120 mins for 120 years.

The Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation:

In September we plan to start the next preparation courses for the above sacraments. This year we are planning to introduce some new initiatives in line with the Church's expressed wish for sacramental catechesis to include the family, and encourage a deep respect for, and understanding of, the sacraments. Any family who wishes their child/ren to take part in either course should complete an application form by the end of the first week of September. Forms can be found in the entrance porch of all three churches. All families will be invited to an individual chat before the courses start—only for about 10 minutes—to ensure they understand what is involved. Children are eligible for 1st Holy Communion preparation from 7 years old. Young people are eligible for Confirmation preparation from 11 years old.

How Can Parents Get Involved?

Pray Together: Begin praying as a family for the grace and understanding needed for the sacrament.

Attend Mass Regularly: Make attending Mass a priority, so children and young people can witness the Eucharist in action.

Engage in Preparation: Encourage your child on their faith journey. Your involvement at home makes a huge difference!

The school aged immunisation service is changing the way we ask for vaccination consents

Dear parents /carers

The school-aged immunisation service, or SAIS team, has been working with NHS England to improve how vaccinations are recorded and managed in schools, to ensure vaccination data for children and young people is accurate and timely. This will also help to reduce vaccination errors and protect children and young people and improve the online consent experience for parents and carers.

Consequently, NHS England have developed a new digital platform called MAVIS: Manging Vaccinations In School. This is a new national system which will be rolled out nationally over the next few months. Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust's (LPT) SAIS team has been one of two organisations to successfully pilot this new system, nationally.

What changes to expect from the new platform

The SAIS team will now contact you directly to request consent for vaccinations, instead of information being sent via your school. This new approach will make it quicker and easier for you to give or refuse consent for vaccinations. If consent is not received the service will allow the children or young person to self-consent if aged over 13 years and competent.

The SAIS team will request a class list from your child's school containing your child's name, date of birth, and contact information, such as phone numbers and emails addresses for parents/ carers of young people who are eligible for the vaccinations. The SAIS team will then use these contact details to send consent requests and reminders directly to parents/carers.
