
Newsletter

Christ declared, "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church" (Matthew 16:18), entrusting him with the keys of the Kingdom. Peter became the first Pope, guiding the early Church with authority received directly from Christ, and was martyred in Rome.

Saint Paul, though not one of the Twelve, was chosen by divine grace to be the Apostle to the Gentiles. A former persecutor, he was converted through a vision of the Risen Christ. Through his inspired epistles and missionary journeys, Paul proclaimed the Gospel throughout the Roman world.

Both apostles bore witness to Christ through their martyrdom in Rome. The Church honors them together on June 29, celebrating their unity in faith and

Saint Thomas the Apostle, one of the Twelve chosen by Our Lord, is venerated for his journey from doubt to profound faith. After the Resurrection, he proclaimed the divinity of Christ with the words, "My Lord and my God!" a declaration beloved in Catholic devotion and often repeated at the Elevation during Holy Mass. According to Sacred Tradition, Saint Thomas evangelized India, where he founded churches, baptized the faithful, and ultimately received the martyr's crown. The Church honors him as a fearless witness to the Risen Christ, a model for those who seek truth, and a patron of unwavering faith.
