
Newsletter

Travel & Timings

Collection

- All children should be collected from their usual classrooms (R/KS1) at 4:30pm.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION ADVENT TERM 2025

Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

We are excited to share that this term, we have begun teaching the new Religious Education Directory, known as the RED, in our Religious Education lessons. This marks an important and exciting new chapter in how we teach Religious Education.

The RED has its own specially designed model curriculum, made up of six branches. Each half-term, we explore one of these branches in class. Each one focuses on a core theme, helping children to grow in their understanding of key aspects of the Catholic faith — including Revelation, Scripture, life in Christ, and life in the Church.

What makes this new approach so special, is that it not only helps pupils learn about their faith in a deeper, more meaningful way, but also invites them to reflect on what it means for their own lives. It helps them to see, judge, and act with greater understanding and compassion.

We're really looking forward to embedding this new vision for Religious Education into our classrooms. To help keep you informed and involved, we'll be sending out a newsletter each term with updates on what your child is learning.

Curriculum branches are the way the programme of study presents its model curriculum. There are six half term branches which are the same in each year group:

Advent term 1 - Creation and Covenant - Encounter the God who creates and calls all people with a focus on the accounts of Creation.

Advent term 2 - Prophecy and Promise - Explore the expectant waiting for the Messiah through the Advent season.

Lent term 1 - Galilee to Jerusalem - Experience the ministry of Jesus and the Word of God. They will learn through parables, encounters, miracles and teachings.

Lent term 2- Desert to Garden - Study the season of Lent and its culmination in the events of Holy Week.

Pentecost term 1- To the ends of the Earth - Study the events that flowed from the Resurrection and Ascension in the coming of the Holy Spirit and the work of the apostles and early Church.

Pentecost term 2 - Dialogue and Encounter - Learn how Christians work together with people of different religious backgrounds, building an understand that all people work towards a common good and should respect all humanity.

How can you support your child at home?

Conversation:

Discuss what your child is learning in RE

Experiences:

Help your child to link RE learning to their everyday life.

Scripture:

Explore some of the scripture shared with your child at home e.g. through homework activities shared Ouiet Reflection:

Encourage your child to spend time in quiet reflection, either through prayer, meditation, or simply taking time to pause and take in the importance of having some quiet time

Attendance



As we continue our journey through the school year, I want to express my sincere gratitude and pride for the commitment shown by our families in ensuring high attendance at St. John Fisher. Regular attendance is a key part of our children's formation, echoing the commitment and discipline we strive to instill in every pupil.

The classes with the highest attendance so far this year are:

1st place: Year 4 - 97.3% 2nd Place: Year 2 - 97.1%

3rd Place: Year 6 and Reception - 96%

Our target is always to have attendance above 97%. Last week, attendance across all year groups was 96.9%.

Unfortunately, our whole school attendance is below where it was compared to last year. We need this to improve for your child's education.

A day off school not only means they miss out a day's education. It means that learning missed out on can lead to gaps in other lessons that build on prior learning.

Remember that excellent attendance leads to amazing achievements.

A Gentle Reminder on Absence Procedures

While we strive for perfect attendance, we understand that illness is unavoidable. When your child is unwell, please exercise careful judgment regarding their fitness for school. The health and well-being of all pupils and staff remain paramount.

- Reporting Absence: Parents/carers must contact the school office by 9:00

 a.m. on the first day of absence, clearly stating the reason.
- **Medical Evidence:** For medical or dental appointments, we kindly request that you provide the school office with **evidence of the appointment** (e.g., an appointment card or letter).
- Extended Absence: If your child is absent for more than a few days, we
 would expect that they have been seen by a medical professional to justify
 the extended time away from their learning.

SPORT NEWS

YEAR 3 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT



On Wednesday 26th November, 10 Year 3 children attended a Development Day at Sir Jonathan North with five other schools. The idea behind the day was to think about improving self-confidence during sport-based activities. The children enthusiastically took part in an assortment of activities during the morning for example, Throw, Clap, Catch, Speed Bounce and Throwing the Ball through a Basketball Hoop. The children were asked to keep their own scores, noting when they had beaten their previous score, which they recorded in their own booklets. In addition, the children also had to write down how many times they had beaten their score, and this determined whether they were awarded a Gold, Silver or Bronze for that particular activity. As many previous scores were beaten our excited children were awarded many Golds, Silvers and Bronzes. All of the children thoroughly enjoyed the morning.
