
Newsletter

School Attendance & Appointments



We would like to remind families of the importance of regular school attendance.

We have noticed a higher number of absences at the start of this half-term, and we appreciate your support in helping every child attend school consistently and on time.

Medical Appointments

For any medical or dental appointments during the school day, parents are required to send written confirmation (such as an appointment letter, text, or email) to the school before the appointment takes place.

Reminders:

- If your child is unwell or unable to attend school, please contact the school before 9:00 a.m. on the day of absence to let us know the reason.
- If your child has been absent for more than three days, we kindly ask that you provide a doctor's note or medical evidence to support the absence.

READING TOGETHER



Our Approach to Books and Development

We know that learning to read is one of the most exciting journeys your child takes! As they grow, they move from learning to read (focusing on phonics in Reception and Year 1) to reading to learn across all subjects.

To support this journey, we want to share how we manage your child's reading books and how you can help at home. We are committed to giving every child access to a wide variety of high-quality books across many genres.

We regularly check your child's progress to ensure they are reading books that are the "just right" level—challenging enough to help them improve, but not so hard that they become frustrated.

We use a system of coloured Book Bands for fiction books, which help us guide your child to appropriate texts:



Blue Year 2 (6+ years)

Yellow Year 2/3/4 (7+ years)

Red Year 4/5 (8+ years)

White Year 5/6 (9+ years)

Important Note on Challenging Themes

Our books are categorised by their reading challenge level and their suggested age level. If your child is assessed as reading at a level higher than their age, they may be moved to a band (e.g., White) that has books typically read by older pupils. These books may sometimes contain more challenging themes or topics appropriate for the older age group. If this happens, we will send home a note to let you know they are reading books above their age level.

Non-Fiction and the School Library

Our school library is filled with a fantastic selection of books!

Your child can choose freely from our large non-fiction section (books about real facts, history, science, etc.) to pursue their own interests.

We also have a huge range of fiction (storybooks) available in the library.

We are excited to invite you to a series of Library Workshops that I will be hosting over the next few months. These will be a great chance to learn more about how to support your child's reading at home and how to use our school library effectively.

The boys played with great determination to draw 2-2 against a well organised St Thomas More.


